## **News from Reception**

This week in Reception we introduced the story Jack Frost by Kazuno Kohara, just in time for the frosty weather! We have studied ice crystals outside and watched how they form in slow motion; we have then created beautiful artwork using candle wax and watercolours. In English, we have written independent sentences inspired by the story, including the digraph we have covered in phonics this week as practice. In maths we have focussed on number lines and missing numbers. The children have all worked very hard during our nativity practices and have performed amazingly in front of an audience; we are very proud!

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, Class 2 have been busy practising and performing our Nativity play with Class 1. Well done to all the children who worked very hard learning their lines and songs. In maths this week, Year 1 have practised addition and subtraction using a number line. Year 2 have added 3 one-digit numbers and solved addition problems by using number bonds to ten. In English we wrote our own questions about the moon which we will answer next week in our information texts.

#### **News from Class 3**

This week, the children have completed assessments in maths, reading, spelling and grammar. We have continued our maths topic of addition and subtraction. The children completed subtractions across a 100 boundary. In English, pupils completed their newspaper report based on Shackleton's journey to Antarctica. In our topic of 'Island Life', the children have looked at how maps have changed over time and why some maps of Earth look different.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have continued exploring equivalence of fractions in Year 5, and we have been working on adding mixed numbers in Year 6. In English, we have continued exploring 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan writing first person recounts of the events. We have also completed our end of term assessments for reading, spelling, punctuation and grammar and maths. In IPC, we have looked at religious beliefs in the Benin Empire. We have also enjoyed putting the final touches to our Christmas production, and we can't wait for the performances next week.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – This week, there has been no PE for Class 1 due to the Cinemac visit.

Class 2 – The children have been doing circuit training, including different ways to move and control equipment and their bodies. In gymnastics, we practised rolling and balancing, our bodies controlled.

Class 3 & 4 – This week, in gymnastics, we performed a thirty second sequence in a group of 3 or 4, including balances, rolls, jumps and travelling. In hockey, we played a match, learning and understanding the rules and how to play the game.
