# Curriculum update

**Class 1 St John's** – In Class one this week we have welcomed back our quail chicks after the Easter holiday. They have grown such a lot! We have been learning about growth and change and after planting our sunflower seeds we started a sunflower diary that we will write in every week. We set up an experiment to work out what seeds need in order to grow. We planted one seed and we have given it sunshine and water. We then planted another seed but we have given it only sunshine. The last seed we have given just water and it has no sunshine at all. We'll let you know what happens next!

**Class 1 Pott Shrigley** – This week in Class 1 we have started our new topic, Water. We have explored the water cycle, the uses of water and what they use water for on a daily basis. In Literacy, we have started looking at Quest Stories, focusing on the text 'Lost and Found'. In Maths, we have been concentrating on doubling and halving numbers as well as addition and subtraction of multiples of 10.

**Class 2 St John's** – In literacy this week we have been using adjective to expand noun phrases and trying to add lots of description into our writing. In maths we have moved on to looking at units of measurement and in IPC we have started our exciting new topic called being human. We drew round our bodies and had a go at placing all our internal organs in the correct places and today we have moved onto looking at the central nervous system paying particular attention to the brain and its different functions. The children are busy making their very own brain hats.

**Class 2 Pott Shrigley** – In Class 2 we have been looking at measuring and perimeter. In our literacy sessions, our trip to the zoo has helped us start some persuasive writing. The children have also been learning about inspirational people through our new topic.

**Class 3 St John's** – This week in Class 3, we have been looking at our new IPC topic 'The Holiday Show.' In English, we have been looking at short stories and have started to plan and write our own short story. In Maths, we have focussed on place value and mental addition and subtraction methods.

**Class 3 Pott Shrigley** – This week Class 3 have been exploring fantasy stories from the book, 'Tales from Outer Suburbia'. They have also begun to plan their own short fantasy story. In Maths, Year 5 have been learning to mentally add and subtract money. Year 6 have continued to practise mental methods for multiplication and division. They have started a new topic, 'The Holiday Show'. They have planned a holiday for a family on a budget and researched holiday destinations.
