Curriculum update

Class 1 St John's – This week we have been focusing on time and sequencing a school day. We enjoyed our forest school session - we made bird feeders on the camp fire. We have been trying very hard to put our phonics in to practice by writing signs for our outdoor area.

Class 1 Pott Shrigley – In Class 1 we have been focussing on description writing, using and old, creepy village, to create ideas for a setting. The children have really engaged using all of their senses to produce imaginative pieces of writing. In maths, we have looked at direction and fractions. In science, we have been exploring materials and incorporating this to an art project.

Class 2 St John's – This week in literacy we have been writing our own magical guides to fairyland. In maths we have been looking at pictograms and division. In IPC we have been investigating our lungs and measuring our lung capacity with a peak flow meter.

Class 2 Pott Shrigley – Class 2 have been looking at poetry and the techniques poets use to make images come alive. In maths, we have been solving problems and practising our formal calculation methods.

Class 3 St John's – This week we have been practising ordering numbers, including decimals, in Maths. In English, they have been completing their newspaper reports and evaluating them. The IPC we have been looking at tectonic plates, earthquakes, mountains and volcanoes. In Booster lessons for the Year 6s the children have been doing some final practice for their SATs next week.

Class 3 Pott Shrigley – This week in Class 3 we have finished our newspaper reports based on the story 'Tuesday' by David Weisner. In maths, we have been working on positive and negative numbers. We have also started to translate 2D shapes on graphs. In topic, we have explored how the tectonic plates cause earthquakes, volcanoes and form mountains.

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
