Curriculum update

Class 1 – This week we welcomed a team of firefighters into school. They brought a fire engine and all of their safety equipment with them. We learnt so much about how they stay safe in an emergency and we were able explore the engine and spray water from the hoses. We have also been talking about how special our Mums are and we have been very busy preparing Mother's Day cards ready for Sunday.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have written a diary entry and an alternative ending to our class story. In maths we have been looking at tens and units and the bar method. In IPC we have looked at camouflage and how it keeps animals safe.

Class 3 – We have been doing diary writing/recounts in English this week; we have been looking at Gangsta Granny and Beauty and the Beast. In maths, we have spent most of the week looking at different methods of addition and subtraction. We have also been looking at digital time on a 24 hour clock. In the afternoons, we have been learning about light and shadows.
