Attendance

Non-attendance is one of the single biggest blockers to achievement, with evidence suggesting that an attendance figure of below 96% will have a detrimental effect on the achievement of that individual student. By focusing on good attendance, we can make a significant impact to the outcomes of our pupils. While dealing with the challenges surrounding Covid-19, it felt appropriate to allow some flexibility with attendance authorisations (which remain at the discretion of the school). Although we intend to remain as supportive as possible, it is important to note that attendance will be a priority area this upcoming academic year. Please also note that it is important to inform school, before the start of the school day, if your child is going to be absent. We appreciate your co-operation in this matter.

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have used the text The Odd Egg to inspire our writing; we have discussed how Duck felt and then annotated our own paintings of the egg to describe how the odd egg looks. We candled our duck eggs for the final time, and we identified the blood vessel and embryo in each egg; we drew and annotated the inside of the egg to ensure our understanding of each part. We linked The Odd Egg story to our research when we compared the actual size of each character's egg then moved on to discuss the size differences when looking at dinosaur eggs. This will lead us into our topic of Dinosaur Detectives.

In maths, we have created colour coded numberlines to show odd and even numbers. We used the story 'Two of Everything' by Lilly Toy Hong to develop our discussion around patterns, and we spotted that even numbers occur when we counted objects in twos.

We are continuing to observe our Bluetit nest each day. Everyone is busy sketching how the nest changes daily and we are anticipating the arrival of eggs any day now.

News from Class 2

In maths, Year 1 have looked at multiplication by making arrays, then writing a number sentence to match. Year 2 have used the 2 times table and divided by 2.

In English, Class 2 have started a new book, 'Wolves'. We read the book together and predicted what might happen next. We thought about wolves in other stories we knew and gathered adjectives to describe the wolf. We talked about the difference between a fiction and non-fiction book. In IPC, we continued to look at habitats by researching the animal group we were given in forest school. We drew a poster with facts about the habitat and how the animal is adapted to suit this environment.

News from Class 3

This week, the children have continued their topic of fractions. The children have compared and ordered non-unit fractions, looked at fractions on a number line and added two fractions together. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our class book of 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes. We have looked at how characters feelings can change over time and how. In our new topic of 'Shake It', we researched the story of milk. In R.E., we looked at the story of Moses before creating model baskets.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on angles, focusing on recognising acute, obtuse and reflex angles and calculating angles around a point. Year 6 have been exploring the internal angles in quadrilaterals and polygons and looking at the key language linked to circles. In English, we have read to book, 'The Princess' Blankets' by Carol Ann Duffy, and we started planning and writing our own stories based on the structure of the book. We have also been exploring, and completing art work, based on the kings and queens of England since 1066 ready for our Coronation celebration event in a couple of weeks.
