## Curriculum update

**Class 1** – This week we have focussed on the life cycle of a plant. We have read the story 'The Tiny Seed' and tracked the stages of growth from a seed to a plant. In maths we have made number lines using numicon and unifix and then looked at one more and one less. We have also been busy planning our new Woodland School space ready for next week.

**Class 2** – This week year two have been busy preparing for their SATs; we have been concentrating on fractions of amounts, missing number sentences and division. Year one have been busy with their mini project learning all about different types of boats. We have started our new IPC topic of 'Oceans and Seas' in which we have planned what we want to learn about. This includes sea creatures, pollution of our oceans and the water cycle.

**Class 3** – In English, the children have been writing persuasive letters and learning techniques to persuade readers to agree with them. In maths, Year 3 have been looking at finding fractions of amounts and Year 4 have been learning how to use the grid and ladder methods of multiplication. In IPC, we have started our 'Inventions' topic by looking at some famous inventors.

**Class 4** – What a busy first week back! We have been revising for our end of year tests which take place soon. I would like to thank the pupils for all their hard work and for their amazing attitudes. The year 5 pupils have been so supportive of the year 6s, and they should all be very proud of themselves.

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
