

### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have focused on the story, The Three Billy Goats Gruff. Each day we have practised using interesting vocabulary related to the story and then we've joined in with retelling the story as a class. We have drawn pictures of what we believe the troll looks like as well as the bridge structure before labelling and writing descriptive sentences. Everyone enjoyed a walk to Tinker's Clough as part of a geography field trip. We tracked the route on a map and took photos of the interesting things we spotted on our journey. At Tinker's Clough we re-enacted the story over the bridge and read a new version of our focus story, The Troll by Julia Donaldson. In maths we have focused on positional language, using bridges and trolls to inspire our learning.

### **News from Class 2**

In English this week, Year 2 have used the story 'The Disgusting Sandwich' as inspiration, creating our own sandwiches outside and writing instructions for how to make them. Year 1 wrote a character description for the troll based on 'Three Billy Goats Gruff'. In maths, we continued our work on fractions, looking at halves and quarters. Year 2 also looked at telling the time. In IPC we started to look at our new topic, 'The Circus Comes to Town'. We all enjoyed the first week in our academies on Wednesday.

### **News from Class 3**

This week in maths, Class 3 have started to look at money. We have created our concept grid and looked at how to convert between pounds and pence. We have started to look at word problems associated with money. In English, we have continued to read our class book 'Weslandia' by Paul Fleischman. The children have started to design a fact file about the new land. We have completed our topic of 'Feel the Force'. We looked at buoyancy, up thrust and density. We then created a boat out of foil and tested how many pennies it could hold.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week in maths, Year 5 have been working on multiplying and dividing by 10,100 and 1000 and learning about negative numbers. In Year 6, the children have been exploring spirals and completing investigations, using logical systems to approach problems. In English, we have finished reading 'Otto: The Autobiography of a Teddy Bear' by Tomi Ungerer, and we have written either speeches or diary entries in role as Otto, recounting the significant events in his life. In RE, we have been exploring the questions- How can religious communities live together in peace? We have also started rehearsing for the Leavers' Assembly, and we had some last minute practice for our performance at the Bridgewater Hall next week.
