


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### Curriculum update

**Class 1** – This week in Reception we have been learning all about pirates! In maths we have been halving our treasure to share between two pirates. We have also looked at odd and even numbers. We have been looking back at our learning throughout Reception and practising our lines for our Reception assembly. We've been learning lots of pirate phrases and walking the plank in phonics!

**Class 2** – This week in class two we have been thinking about refugees and comparing the life we have to that of a refugee child. In maths we have been using coordinates. We were also lucky enough to spend the morning at St Oswald's church for the Eucharist service and the Moses experience.

**Class 3** – In English, the children have been reading and planning their own newspaper reports. In maths, the children have been revisiting 2D shapes, including quadrilaterals. We went to church on Wednesday afternoon where the children enjoyed learning about the life of Moses with Reverend Veronica and other helpers. On Thursday we enjoyed a very active trip to Quinta Nature Reserve. The children were involved in stream dipping, den building, marshmallow toasting, a game of man-hunt, making clay faces, a scavenger hunt and making a fire.

**Class 4** – This week, class 4 have been studying data collection in mathematics, looking at scatter graphs and line graphs. In English, we have been continuing our work on 'Street Child'. We have started our new IPC topic, 'What Price Progress'. Rehearsals have been going really well, and we can promise you a wonderful leavers' production. For refugee week, we explored the different reasons people may leave their homes and had a whole class discussion.



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
