Curriculum update

Class 1 – This week the children planned to learn all about holidays. We have made our own passports and we practised writing our own signatures. We have packed a suitcase for a range of different destinations and we have discussed where we would like to visit in the future. In maths we have looked at basic co-ordinates and put our learning into practise during our orienteering sessions. We had to read maps and find the clues dotted all around school.

Class 2 – This week we have learnt all about Amelia Earhart. We have made timelines of her life and wrote our own biographies. We have also looked at the history of flight and the Wright flyer. We have ended the week by making our own model aircrafts.

Class 3 – On Monday, Class 3 enjoyed a trip to Manchester Airport's Runway Visitor Park. The children spent time on-board the Monarch DC10 aircraft, spent time learning about Concorde, and watched the planes take off from the runway. There are lots of photos on our school website. In maths, the children have been learning about mass by measuring in kilograms and grams. In English, this week has all been about poetry; the children have been writing their own shape poems and thinking about different techniques used in poetry.

Class 4 – This week, we have started a 'Theme Park' project. In maths, we have been designing our parks and calculating the costs. We have also worked out our expenses and profits. In English, we have been designing persuasive leaflets to advertise the park. We have also been completing last minute rehearsals for our leavers' production, Oliver!
