We all enjoyed making an apple crumble with the apples from our orchard.

News from Class 2

In English this week, and for National Poetry Day, we had an excellent workshop which involved singing, rhyming and listening to music! We have been very busy – exploring money, ordinal numbers and number lines in maths. We have also enjoyed exploring daylight hours in different seasons and how the rotation of the Earth causes these differences. Our highlight of the week was creating posters to represent different emotions in PSHE and presenting them to the class – we have some excellent artists in Class 2!

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have worked hard to develop their fluency with place value. They have recapped their prior learning of adding 1, 10, 100 and 1000. The children have ordered numbers and placed them onto a number line. In English, the pupils have continued our class book called 'The Tear Thief'. We have built up our confidence with creating similes, using them to describe imagery from the book. In history, the pupils have continued to research Bronze Age Britain, and they have looked at how trade started to develop during this time. In science, we have researched how the body converts food into energy.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on column addition and subtraction, including multiple exchanges. Year 6 have been working on long multiplication and short and long division. In English, we have been planning and writing biographies about Philippe Petit. A highlight of this week has been exploring the Mars Rovers in our computing lesson.
