## **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have learnt all about the four seasons and their key features. We used the book 'Tree' to introduce new vocabulary and to link our own experiences. In maths we have looked at the composition five and represented our learning in a part whole model. We are well under way with our nativity practice and the children are all doing brilliantly!

## **News from Class 2**

This week in Class 2, we have been exploring the 'oa' and 'ey' sounds in phonics with a huge degree of success. In geography, we enjoyed learning about position and direction, and then used this knowledge to help us create a map for the school playground. During maths this week Year 1 have been working hard on related number facts and adding more, whereas Year 2 have been working on

adding 2-digit numbers. We have practised our Christmas nativity play this week and it is coming together nicely! Thank you all for coming along to the Year 1 Parent Lunch. It was lovely to see so many families.

#### **News from Class 3**

This week in maths, the children have worked hard to develop their fluency with formal methods of addition and subtraction. The children have continued to practise column addition/subtraction and counting using a number line. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our class book, 'Escape from Pompeii.' We have started to write vivid descriptions and look at how to expand noun phrases. In science, we have started to look at contact and non-contact forces. In computing, the children have started to include loops in their codes.

## **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Class 4 have continued working on fractions. Year 5 have been mastering converting between mixed numbers and improper fractions. Year 6 have been finding fractions of amounts and consolidating all the skills they have learned during their fractions block. In English, we finished reading 'The Unforgotten Coat' by Frank Cottrell Boyce. We have written in role, as Julie, one of the characters from the text. A highlight of this week has been our science lesson where we explored thermal conductivity.
