## **News from Reception**

This week, we have read the story of The Odd Fish which taught us all about the dangers of plastic in the ocean. We have created our own models of the odd fish using recycled materials to remind us about the importance of keeping the oceans clean. We have carried out an ocean rescue using our small world role play area. In maths, we have looked at Hungarian number frames to help us understand how to count on when making ten.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, our highlight has been creating leaflets about wolves using our knowledge of adjectives, non-fiction and connectives. In maths, we have completed our learning about shapes. Year 2 have moved on to lines of symmetry, and Year 1 have begun exploring numbers to 20. Our new science topic, Animals and Humans, has allowed us to explore our senses. Our first Forest School session on Friday was fantastic, and we can't wait to continue our outdoor learning.

## **News from Class 3**

This week, in maths, the children have continued their topic of multiplication and division. They have multiplied 2-digit numbers by a one-digit number and multiplied by 10 and 100. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our topic of myths. This week, we moved away from Norse myths and explored the Greek myths of Persephone and the Pomegranate Seeds, King Midas, and Pandora's Box. We have created predictions and written as a character. In history, we have looked at the Roman Invasion of Britain and of Boudicca's rebellion.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been learning long multiplication, multiplying up to 4-digit by 2-digit numbers, and they have been dividing 4-digit by 1-digit numbers using a compact method, recording their remainders as fractions. In Year 6, we have been working on ratio and proportion. In English, we have been researching key facts about NACA and NASA in preparation for starting our new Literacy Tree book, Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race, by Margot Lee Shetterly. A highlight this week has been writing our own opera lyrics for a recitative and putting them to music.
