### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have been studying birds; we learnt about the features that all birds have plus how these features might look different depending on where the bird lives and what it eats. We have labelled the parts of bird and created collages of nests. We dissected an owl pellet to reveal what it had eaten, and then we identified and sorted each bone. In maths, we introduced balance scales. We focused on developing our understanding of balanced, heavier and lighter by weighing a range of different objects.

### **News from Class 2**

This week something very exciting finally arrived in our classroom - our class pet! It is a stick insect and we can have called him Steven. We have been very busy with our writing tasks in English, writing our own paragraphs and learning how to use spider diagrams. In maths, Year 2 have been recapping money and using this topic to improve our arithmetic. Year 1 have been learning about place value and number lines. Our Forest School session this week was bundles of fun - we love exploring and learning in the outdoors! Thanks to all the parents who came to Year 2's parent lunch on Wednesday. It was so lovely to see you all there!

### **News from Class 3**

This week, in maths, the children have continued their topic of multiplication and division. They have multiplied and looked at related division and multiplication facts, divided 2 digits by 1 digit and scaling. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our topic of myths. The children have designed their mythical heroes and creatures as well as planned the myth that they will create next week. In history, we have looked at different sources describing Boudicca, and then created a picture using that information. In design technology, the children have looked at chopping and peeling skills.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been learning to multiply unit, non-unit fractions and mixed numbers by integers. Year 6 have completed their work on ratio, and we have now started to look at forming algebraic expressions. In English, we have continued our work on the book, Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race, by Margot Lee Shetterly. We have been writing persuasive speeches in character as one of these amazing women, Mary Jackson. Another highlight this week has been exploring developing our drawing skills, creating our own space-inspired art.
