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In school first week back after half term:

Sunday – 10.30am a Mothering Sunday service at St Oswald's. Monday – British Science Week and Commonwealth Day. Wednesday – Full Governing Board meeting. Class 3 and 4 visiting St Oswald's Church. Thursday – Mrs Walker at Diocese meeting.

Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have focussed on story telling. We have used puppets, story maps and picture stories. We have created our own stories and recorded ourselves retelling them. We have started collecting our stories in our 'Helicopter Stories' book which is a technique used to build up children's ability to create a retell stories. In maths we have focussed on weighing. We loved dressing up for World Book Day!

Class 2 – This week we started our exciting new topic of Flowers and insects. We have done a bug hunt and learnt about the different parts of an insect. In literacy we have written a setting description about our new class story 'Tin Forest'. In maths we have been looking at analogue and digital time.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, we have looked at column subtraction and word problems. We have researched how we can create a realistic volcanic eruption. We looked at the properties of fizzy drinks using raisins and designed and carried out an experiment using Coke and Mentos. In literacy, we have started to read escape from Pompeii.

Class 4 – This week, we have been solving problems involving all four number operations in maths. In English, we have been reading 'Can We Save the Tiger?' by Martin Jenkins. We have been writing speeches to inform people about an endangered species and to persuade them to support the cause. In IPC, we have started our new topic, 'What a Wonderful World' and have been looking at the layers that form the earth and the different biomes.

Sports News - Class 1 have focussed on their throwing and catching skills using beanbags, Class 2 have done some football and ball control skills. Class 3 have enjoyed basketball and focused on ball control skills and Class 4 have been playing small team games, working on their basketball skills and playing some football matches.

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
