Curriculum update:

Class 1 – T this week we have enjoyed making front covers for our story books. In maths we have completed our learning on capacity; we measured out the ingredients to make a potion using a syringe. We carefully looked at the millilitre measurements on the side of the syringe. In RE we spent the day learning about the Easter story and then we made hot cross buns to remind us of all the events that happened on Good Friday. We each ate a hot cross bun while they were warm and they were delicious!

Class 2 – This week in Literacy in Year 2 we have begun our SATS preparation and have focused on Nouns, Verbs and Adverbs. In Maths we have focused on partitioning, place value and ordering numbers. We have also been practising our mental arithmetic. In Literacy in Year one we have begun our new class story 'Wild' by Emily Hughes. We have written a character description and done some drama about how the main character feels throughout the story. In maths we have been focusing on the days of the week. In IPC we have been classifying different insects. We have been writing about the life cycles of a butterfly and metamorphosis.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, we have used our knowledge of the times tables to multiply and divide. . In literacy we have interviewed four Roman emperors and started to create a newspaper interview. In IPC, we have created our own class assembly. We used computing to create a PowerPoint.

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Class 4 – In class 4, we have been looking at number sequences and using algebra to show the relationships between numbers in maths. We have also been calculating perimeters and areas of rectangles, compound shapes, parallelograms and triangles. In English, we have started work on a new book, 'The Princess' Blankets' by Carol Ann Duffy. We have looked at the structure of the story and are planning our own versions. In RE, we have been creating art work based on the lyrics to the song 'Amazing Grace'.

Sports News – Reception focussed on moving beanbags around the hall using their feet; they had to keep control and move carefully without bumping into each other. Class 2 worked on their throwing skills and played dodge ball. Year three have enjoyed learning hockey skills, Year 4 had two coaches teach the basics of squash. Class 4 have been playing dodge ball and working on their rugby skills.
