## **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have read the story of Hattie Peck and learnt all about which animals hatch from eggs. This has helped us to predict what will hatch out of the mystery eggs that have appeared in our incubator. We have candled each of the eggs and we identified the embryo and blood vessels. In maths, we have been counting to twenty and beyond and looking at the composition of teen numbers using ten frames and numicon.

## **News from Class 2**

This week, our highlight has been starting lots of new topics. In science, we are learning about plants, and we enjoyed exploring the different types of plants on the school premises. In history, we are learning about the origin of flying and the story of how planes were first made. In maths this week, Year 1 have been counting in 2s and 10s, whilst year 2 have been measuring in centimetres and metres. Our English text, 'Stella and The Moon' has taken us on a path of lunar learning! We have enjoyed being back at school.

## **News from Class 3**

This week, in maths, Year 3 have looked at using scales and measuring in grams and kilograms. Year 4 have looked at the place value of decimals. The children have looked at different suffixes and the present continuous tense. In geography, we created a fact file about Macclesfield Forest. In D&T, we looked at the features of a castle. In PSHE, the children looked at how to call for help in an emergency. For our computing lesson, the children looked at how to create a multiplayer game in Scratch.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been calculating angles within right-angles, straight lines and around a point. Year 6 have been learning to calculate the mean and work out vertically opposite

angles. In English, we have started planning and writing our own stories based on 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol-Ann Duffy. Another highlight this week has been learning about how to manage bleeding in our PSHE lesson.
