Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in reception we have been focusing on ordering numbers and the value of each number. We have created number lines, adding in towers and numicon to help our understanding. In literacy we have looked at the phase 2 tricky words and extended our learning by making simple sentences with the words. We have also written facts about ourselves as we look carefully at what makes us special and the different communities that we are a part of.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been writing persuasive letters and creating story maps for the class story, The Carrot Club. In maths we have been partitioning two digit numbers and looking at what equals means. Year one have been working on one more/one less. In IPC we have created our own portraits made of fruit and written instructions to make a pizza! We were lucky enough to cook pizzas for the whole school! We had lots of fun, photographs will be on the website shortly.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have looked at the properties of 2d shapes. Children have used their bodies and string to create shapes. Children have use mathematical language to describe shapes. In literacy, children have begun to think about writing elements that create a good story. In IPC, children created their own miniature sarcophaguses with pipe cleaner mummies. During the second half of the week children designed, built and evaluated a shaduf.

Class 4 – This week, we have been looking at subtraction by counting up and by using a formal column method in maths. In English, we have started work on a new book, called 'Cloud Tea Monkeys' by Elspeth Graham and Mal Peet. We have been answering comprehension questions about the text and had our own tea tasting! In IPC, we have written information texts about electricity, conductors and insulators and created posters about magnets.

Sports News – This week the Reception child focussed on movement and jumping, learning to roll correctly and practiced their ball skills. Class 2 children played football and worked on their dribbling skills and also did some more gymnastic gymnastics and apparatus work. Class 3 were passing the football between themselves, dribbling and had a football match. Class 4 practiced their football dribbling skills and played a match and also used the apparatus in gymnastics class.
