

Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week we enjoyed our first school trip; exploring Quarry Bank Mill in search of the Tiger Who Came To Tea. Our trip has inspired lots of learning back in the classroom where we have learnt about writing lists and ordering objects according to size. We also welcomed the rangers in to class on Thursday to teach us all about meadows and their inhabitants. We made wildflower seed bombs with clay, soil and seeds. It was a wonderful morning.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have written riddles about different fruits and vegetables. We have also written about food chains. In maths we have been doing multiplication and one more and one less. In IPC we have had a visit from Ranger Martin who taught us all about different habitats and how a food chain works. We learnt about the importance of the start of a food chain and what would happen to the animals and plants that depend on it if it was taken away.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have looked at the properties of 3d shapes. Children have use mathematical language to describe shapes. In literacy, children have created a story and focused on ways to edit and improve their writing. In IPC, children have tested their shadufs.

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Class 4 – This week, class 4 have been analysing setting descriptions and dialogue from the 'Cloud Tea Monkeys', and we have started writing our own stories, using the book as an inspiration. In maths, we have been looking at 2d shape, focusing on the properties of the shapes and how to calculate missing angles. In IPC, we have been discussing the materials which artists use and creating our own art using different materials.

Sports News – Class 1 focussed on their movement skills through catching and throwing. Class 2 played invasion games, practised their football dribbling skills and did some fantastic gymnastics. Class 3 played tag rugby and also took part in gymnastics. Class 4 also played tag rugby (focussing on movement and running whilst passing the ball) and match-play hockey.
