## **International School Award**


We are delighted to have been awarded the Foundation Level of the International School Award run by the British Council. This award is part of our ongoing dedication to Global Learning.

#### Curriculum update:

**Class 1** – This week in Reception we have learnt all about the history of Bonfire Night. We have role played how to stay safe around bonfires and fireworks and what to do in an emergency. In maths we have focussed on the number 6 and we have made posters to show our knowledge. In literacy we have written words to describe how a firework looks and sounds. We have learnt about the importance of Remembrance Day and we have made iced poppy biscuits.

**Class 2** – In literacy we have written Bonfire night acrostic poems. We have also started looking at our new class story called 'The Grotlyn'. In maths we have been concentrating on 2D shapes and sorting shapes. We have started our new topic of materials and used clay to make Remembrance Day Poppies. We have placed these Poppies on the Cenotaph in Kerridge. They will remain there until Sunday evening, please feel free to go and have a look.

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**Class 3** – A great start to the second half of this term. In maths, children have looked at different methods of subtraction. In literacy, children have thought about how to show a characters emotion throughout a story. In IPC, children have started their new topic of Bright Sparks.

**Class 4** – This week, in class 4, we have been working on using equivalence of fractions to help us order and compare them, and we have been practising finding fractions of numbers. In English, we have been reading 'Way Home' by Gregory Rogers, and extracting key information about the main character, backing up our responses with evidence from the text, and we have written poems. In IPC, we have been looking at the parts of the ear and their functions.

**Sports News** – We have had a great start after half term in our PE lessons. Reception enjoyed a fantastic space awareness and movement session, together with lots of throwing, catching and some football. Class 2 had an early morning football lesson and even got to play matches and then moved on to basketball dribbling and shooting in the afternoon. Class 3 had a fab basketball lesson which we finished with a whole class tournament and Class 4 had a fun lesson on passing and movement within basketball and then had some competitive football matches.
