We were delighted to welcome parents into school this week for the start of our Chinese New Year celebrations during Stay, Play and Pray on Tuesday; and for a Year 1 lunch date on Wednesday. Year 5 had a Fire Service assembly on Tuesday and Class 3 led wonderful worship yesterday based on our current theme of 'Hope.'

Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week we have planned our own fairytales using story planning cards. We have started to prepare our storytelling boxes which we are filling with pictures of characters and settings, along with any other objects that represent events in our story. In maths we have focused on the number 12 and how we can represent this number in different ways. We have also continued with our focus on measuring. We set up a science investigation to see which materials would work best as a pair of shoes, the children did well with making predictions and testing each material.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been writing letters to Tesco explaining the issues orang-utans face due to deforestation and the use of palm oil. We have also produced non-fiction leaflets on orang-utans. In topic work we have created our own glossaries and sorted different rainforest creatures into categories. We have learnt the difference between deciduous and evergreen trees and also what the climate is like in the rainforest and why. We have begun learning about elephant poaching and the ivory trade and have started writing our own newspaper reports about the threats to elephants. In maths we have made bar charts containing all the birthdays in the class, we have found out the most and least popular months for birthdays in Class 2. We have moved on to learning about money.

Class 3 – In maths, children have continued to look at solving addition and subtraction problems. In literacy, we have continued our myths and legends topic. We have read created and edited our own myths. In IPC, we have created a map of the school.

Class 4 – This week, we have been practising formal methods of multiplication and division and looking at multiples and factors in maths. In English, we have been writing narratives based on our current book, 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. In IPC, we have been looking at the social structure in Ancient Maya, and we have explored primary and secondary sources of information and considered what they can teach us.

Sports News – It's been a great week in PE! The Reception children had 2 really fun lessons; one on body movement and sequences in gymnastics and a second on football dribbling. Class 2 played really well at their football and basketball session this week. Class 3 played hockey and Class 4 had a good technical lesson on basketball by talking about the 'when and where' to dribble and pass.
