

Updated Covid-19 Advice from the LA

The Local Authority are continuing to monitor high cases numbers across Cheshire East, which are currently at their highest level since the pandemic began last March. Please ensure you have read the LA letter which was sent out this week detailing new procedures for isolation.

Covid-19 Advice

If your child has any of the main Covid-19 symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste), they should not attend school and should stay at home. You should arrange for them to get a PCR test and tell us the test results. Your child should not attend school while you are waiting for test results, even if they are feeling better. If the test is negative, they should go to school as normal. If they test positive, they should continue to isolate and follow public health advice.

News from Class 1

This week in Reception, we have looked at the beautiful book, 'One Day, So Many Ways.' This book is all about the daily routines of children from around the world, and we focused on key moments in our day. The children looked at the similarities and differences between their routines and those of children in different countries. In maths, we have looked at how to be a 'careful counter' using puppets and groups of objects to help us. In phonics, the children have practised their segmenting and blending skills with some of the new sounds we have learnt.

News from Class 2

This week, in English, we have started our new class story called 'Cave Baby,' by Julia Donaldson. We explored what we thought the story might be about using Stone Age artefacts. We thought about a time we'd done something naughty and how it made us feel, and we used this to write independent sentences. Next, we looked at the rhyming patterns in the story, created actions for every character, and we wrote our own rhyming sentences. The class have ended the week by retelling the story in their own words. In maths, Year 1 have been using part whole models to do simple addition. Year 2 have been mastering how to use a place value chart and have been solving place value word problems. In IPC, we looked at our baby photos. The children massively enjoyed guessing which baby was which child, and we used these to create a wonderful class display and a piece of writing about how we have changed.

News from Class 3

Class 3 have started our new class book 'Escape from Pompeii'. Children used inference to decide the setting of the book, and have used their senses to add description. In maths, we have started our new topic of addition and subtraction. We have looked for patterns when adding 1s, 10s and 100s. In our myHappyMind session this week, the children have looked at how breathing can help us to

feel calm. Class 3 have continued our topic of 'Scavengers and Settlers.' This week, we examined how Stone Age housing changed over time and completed a practical lesson finding out about the Stone Age diet.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have continued our learning about addition and subtraction. We have been focusing on subtraction involving multiple exchanges, and how to use the inverse operation to solve missing number problems. In English, we have started work on our new book, 'Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race,' by Margot Lee Shetterly. This week, we have been writing non-chronological reports about NASA. In our topic 'What Price Progress?' we have been looking at inventions and scientific discoveries, and the impacts that they have had on society.

Sports News

Class 1 – The children focused on their resting and active heart rate, checking them before, during and after their busy PE session. The children warmed up by moving in a range of different ways; forwards, backwards, jumping, hopping and skipping, to build on their spatial awareness. Everyone enjoyed a superhero game where they had to move around obstacles, jumping over and circling round as they travelled.

Class 2 – This week, we played no contact dodgeball and had a hula hoop relay race.

Class 3 – In football, the children have been dribbling and passing with accuracy. In basketball, they have focussed on target practice and throwing techniques.

Class 4 – This week, we have worked on dribbling and passing skills and have taken part in races and games, in both football and basketball.
