Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have started our new nature topic. We have started by focussing on mini beasts and their micro habitats. We have explored our woodland area to find different mini beasts and then linked their needs to why they live in certain areas. We have placed our chicken eggs inside our incubator and learnt all about the stages of development for the embryo. The children are very excited! In maths we have started to learn about doubling, this will continue next week.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been looking at noun phrases, adjectives and homophones. We have written a setting description for the secret garden in our class story, The lion and the unicorn. In maths we have been looking at number patterns and labelling number lines. In IPC we have started our new topic called 'Seeing the light'. We have thought about light and dark places and started to investigate light sources. Please could you bring in any unwanted cd's and cardboard kitchen roll tubes as next week we will be making our own spectroscopes.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have looked at Roman numerals. In literacy, children have started a new book, 'The Hodgeheg' by Dick King-Smith. In IPC we have started a new topic Paintings Pictures and Photographs. Children have pained their own version of Sunflowers by Van Gogh.

Class 4 – This week, in maths, we have been working on reasoning and problem solving, involving long multiplication and division. In English, we have started a new unit of work, based on 'The Tempest' by Shakespeare. We have been writing descriptions of a storm at sea. We have also started our new IPC topic 'Fairground'.

Sports News – We enthusiastically returned to our PE this week and finally being able to get back onto the field is a real treat for the children. Class 1 and 2 really enjoyed their ball familiarisation lesson and demonstrated some good throwing and fielding skills. Class 3 had a cricket batting and throwing technique lesson whilst Class 4 also enjoyed a cricket lesson, practicing their batting and fielding skills.
