# Curriculum update:

**Class 1** – This week in Reception we have been learning all about the wonderful world of bees. We have read The Flight of the Honey Bee by Raymond Huber and focused on each role that a bee might have in her lifetime. We have made honey flapjacks and beeswax candles. We have made honeycomb prints and a giant painting of a bee to celebrate our learning this week. In maths we have continued to look at odd and even numbers and we have now moved on to looking at halving. After a long wait, we welcomed 4 tiny chicks on Thursday night, the children are so excited!

**Class 2** – This week in literacy we have been writing speech bubbles for the owl characters in our class story, Owl babies. We have also retold the story from the point of view of the mother owl. In maths we have been looking at 2D/3D shapes and moved onto looking at different types of scales and how to read them. In IPC we have looked at how shadows are created and we drew around our shadows and measured them on the playground. We looked at different materials and investigated which ones let light pass through. We also found different light source around the school and decided whether or not they were light sources or reflectors of light.

**Class 3** – This week, in maths, children have continued to look at word problems. In literacy, we started to look at Indian folk tales starting with the book 'The Tiger Child'. In IPC, children have looked at different styles of painting and have created a self-portrait.

**Class 4** – This week, while the year 6 pupils have been doing their SATs, the year 5s have been completing optional tests. Their attitudes have all been fantastic! The year 5s have also been completing ICT, looking at, and comparing, different search engines.

**Sports News** – Class 1 and 2 tried out various batting shots in cricket this week. Class 3 played a cricket match and Class 4 enjoyed a game of rounders.
