#### **Curriculum update:**

**Class 1** – This week in Reception we have learnt all about the history of Bonfire Night; we looked at the story of Guy Fawkes and discussed how to stay safe around fireworks and bonfires. We read the story 'Sparks in the Sky' and then came up with lots of ways to describe how fireworks look and sound. In maths we have focused on the properties of common 2D shapes. We have shared photos of Uganda and looked through the letters the children wrote to us.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been gathering information and doing research about Roald Dahl. We have used this to write our own biographies. In maths we have looked at 2D and 3D shapes and focused on counting vertices, sides and faces. In IPC we have turned our wonderful half term photography projects into beautiful pieces of work which are displayed in our classroom. We have also learnt how to take photos on a digital camera and have each taken a photograph around the school that we are going to learn how to improve. Mrs Stout says a huge thank you to everyone for their wonderful Reading Rivers, which will be displayed around the school.

Class 3 – We have had a great first week back. This week, in maths, children have looked at adding and subtracting near multiples of 10, 100 and 1000. In literacy, children have started finished the story of 'The first drawing' and have begun to create their own stories based on this book. We have started our new IPC topic of 'Chocolate' and this week children have completed their knowledge harvest and thought about where cacao trees grow. This half terms' spellings and homework grid are as usual on the class website, there will be a hard copy stuck into children's books once they have brought them in.

**Class 4** – This week, in English, we have been working on answering questions fully, backing up our responses with evidence and including a good amount of detail. In maths, we have been comparing fractions by finding a common denominator. In IPC, we have introduced our new topic 'Express Yourself'.

**Sports News** – This week classes 1 and 2 have started their lessons focused on jumping skills and team games. Learning various types of jumps and practising them in different situations. They have also been finding out how to work together in small teams, swapping roles a number of types.

Classes 3 and 4 will be splitting their time this half term between hockey and a key skills fitness circuit. Sadly, due to the weather hockey was put on hold and we carried on with our circuit inside followed by a silent bench ball tournament, which both classes competed in with great success.
