Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have read our new text, A Dot in the Snow. We recreated artwork showing a dot in the snow and we have written a sentence about what we might see if we were in the Arctic. We carried out a science investigation about freezing and melting. We placed blocks of ice in different location to see which would melt first and why. In maths we created posters showing how we can represent the number 7 and we have recorded sums in our books showing the different ways of making 7.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have continued to look at the story 'Coming home' we have been learning about verbs and thinking about different verbs we could use to describe the robins movements throughout his journey. In maths we have been using the number facts we already know to help us work out the answers to addition and subtraction problems. In IPC we have made a timeline of all of our living memories which we have photographed and put onto the school website. We have also written biographies using our homework about our chosen significant people. We have begun to look at leaders and thought about which qualities good leaders need to have.

Class 3 – Class 3 have started to really get stuck into our new topic 'Active Planet'. This week we researched where volcanoes can be found and what happens when a volcano erupts. In literacy, children have continued with their book 'Escape from Pompeii' we have created some great newspaper reports. In maths, children have looked at solving addition problems.

Class 4 – This week, in maths, we have been working on ordering, and calculating the intervals between, positive and negative numbers. We have also been using BODMAS to know the order in which with should perform the operations in calculations. In English, we have started writing newspaper reports, based on 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy. In IPC, we have been exploring the city states in Ancient Greece, creating PowerPoint presentations. We have also started to learn about the Persian Wars.

Sports News – In gymnastics, this week Classes 1 and 2 have built on last week's knowledge and moved on to balancing on different body parts for at least 5 seconds. Adding shapes and balances together to create new routines. Classes 3 and 4 continued to work with control over their bodies, focusing this week on landing safely and performing various types of jumps in the air. Working to add jumps into their sequences which already contained different movements.
