### **News from Reception**

This week, in Reception, we have learnt all about Mars. We have painted, made models of the Mars Rover and written facts about our neighbouring planet. We all enjoyed carrying out a science experiment to discover how craters are made and what changes their size and shape. In maths, we have continued our focus on the number 7, using numicon and multi link to help us work out the composition before creating sums. In literacy, after finding the mysterious space objects last week, we have written a missing poster for an alien.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, in English, we have written our own versions of the story 'Lost and Found'. We changed the animal in the story and researched where each animal came from. In Maths, we worked on reasoning problems, including time, money and shape activities. In IPC, we attempted our own game of tug of war. We worked out how this could be a fair test and decided the teams should be a mixture of boys and girls and Year 1 and 2. We drew diagrams of the game and labelled the forces we used. We have also created our own glossaries for our new topic. In aid of science week, we were visited by Mr Timmis, and we learnt all about adaptations and designed and made our own Martians out of play dough.

#### **News from Class 3**

Class 3 have completed our stories based on our class book, 'Black Dog' by Levi Pinfold. We have looked at how we can edit and improve our work. In maths, we have continued to look at measurements, as well as completing our assessments. As part of British Science Week, the children have researched Mars and investigated ways to make it habitable for humans.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have continued exploring the concept of measurement, looking at conversions between metric and imperial units. In English, we have started work on a new book, called 'The Lost Thing', by Shaun Tan. We have been thinking of adjectives and verbs to describe the soundtrack to the trailer, and using these to make predictions about the story. We have also completed our Spring Term assessments this week. In IPC, we have been comparing the Greek city states of Athens and Sparta.

# **Sports News**

Class 1 – In PE, the children played team games that encouraged them to find individual objects and count them. The children had to follow more complicated instructions in order to win.

Class 2 – In PE, we practised different types of passes with a football and directed it through a narrow target. We then practised balancing and traveling with different objects on our heads.

Class 3 – In PE, the pupils played tag rugby and were playing passing races and learning all about directional play. In netball, the children were practising their throwing and catching skills.

Class 4 – This week, the children played tri-rugby and were practising their passing and defence skills. In netball, the pupils were learning all about the roles and positions and also practising their throwing and catching skills.
