The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Tree

News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have been scientists! We have carried out an investigation into melting ice and learnt some new key vocabulary. We then candled our chicken eggs to locate the blood vessels and embryo. We focused on the story of The Odd Egg, and the children were fantastic at role playing the duck and other characters as a starting point for discussing emotions. In maths, we have looked at how to be a careful counter when counting larger quantities. Our bluetit family now have at least 8 eggs, and we expect them to hatch at the same time as our incubator chicks.

News from Class 2

This week, in English, we have written a letter of apology to the three bears. We looked at interesting sentence openers and using the word because in a sentence. In maths, we have worked on our quick fire addition skills and moved on to time. We have looked at o'clock and half past times. In IPC, we aimed to answer the question, 'I wonder if water can be used as a force to move things?' The children worked round four outdoor water stations and investigated water wheels, the effect of mass on how easy an object is to move and the effects of different sieves filled with materials. We found out that water could be used as a force and enjoyed getting messy in the playground.

News from Class 3

This week, Class 3 have started a new class book, 'The Chronicles of Narnia: the Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.' The children have looked at 'jumping in' to a sentence with a relative clause and adding detail. In maths, we have continued to look at fractions. We have looked at adding, subtracting and ordering fractions. In IPC, the children have started a new topic, 'All Aboard'. They have completed a knowledge harvest, a glossary and a timeline of significant advancements for rail travel.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been focusing on line graphs, reading, drawing and solving problems involving them. In English, we have been writing our own stories based on 'The Lost Thing', by Shaun Tan. In IPC, we have been learning all about the Persian Wars, and we have been exploring the question: What can the Parthenon teach us, as historians, about Ancient Greece and the Athenians? We have been revising the difference between primary and secondary sources of information and exploring the reliability of different sources.

Sports News

Class 1 – The children practised their throwing and kicking skills to perfect their aim before moving on to their first archery lesson.

Class 2 – In PE this week, we enjoyed a great session of cricket on the field and learnt lots of new skills. We also took part in obstacle races and team races.

Class 3 – In rounders, the children have practised fielding and learned about different roles and responsibilities. In athletics, the children partook in long distance running races.

Class 4 – In rounders, we played mini games, focusing on our fielding skills, and, in athletics, we focused on long distance running.
