#### **News from Reception**

This week, in Reception, we have started our new topic of Brilliant Bugs! To inspire lots of discussion, we started with a mini beast hunt in the woodland area which has helped us gather ideas about what we already know and questions about what we'd like to know. In literacy, we read the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar by Eric Carle, before creating a story map. We linked our science lessons to the vocabulary in this book when we created our own butterfly life cycle wheels. In maths, we have used ten frames and multi link to find different ways of describing numbers according to their pattern and composition.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, in maths, Year 1 have focused on counting in 2s and 10s as well as using concrete materials to help with tricker subtraction problems. Year 2 have focused on recognising quarters and thirds and moved onto finding fractions of amounts. In English, we have finished our story of Iggy Peck and filled thought bubbles with his thoughts using the personal pronoun 'I'. We have learnt what non-fiction leaflets are and gathered some notes to help us write our own. We have created exciting London bus shaped non-fiction leaflets based on our capital city. In history, we have created a large timeline of houses through the ages from the Stone Age to present day. We have then chosen one of these to sketch and write facts about. We have also learnt about different homes around the world and used our homework projects to compare these to our own homes.

#### **News from Class 3**

Class 3 are looking forward to an exciting final half term. This week, we have written stories based on 'The Chronicles of Narnia: the Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe.' The children have used their learning to create a text, including fantastic settings and characters. In maths, the children have started to look at money, including how to convert between pounds and pence. As part of their topic, 'All Aboard', the children have researched advancements in train technology. They have produced art to show movement and machinery using a style based on early 20th century futurism.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been continuing to explore, and solve problems involving, angles within triangles, and Year 5 have been exploring the properties of triangles. In English, we have been exploring the poem, The Tyger by William Blake. We looked at the content and meaning, and then worked on learning part of the poem off by heart to perform to the rest of the class. In IPC, have completed our Knowledge Harvests for our new IPC topic, What a Wonderful World, recording what we already know about planet Earth. In RE, we have started to explore the key question: Does science disprove Genesis? This started with a very lively debate!

#### **Sports News**

Class 1 – As Monday was INSET, there was no PE this week for Class 1. However, a special mention to Bobbie as she is doing particulary well in swimming.

Class 2 – There was no PE this week, as Monday was an INSET day.

Class 3 – This week, in cricket, the children were developing their bowling techniques. In tennis, the children were looking at how to improve their accuracy.
