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Curriculum update

Class 1 Pott Shrigley - Since the start of term class one have been absorbed in learning about themselves. This week we have looked at the towns we live in, what different groups we belong to and how we can make a difference by being a good friend. In Literacy we have been reading stories with familiar settings and have begun to plan our own story about our lost teddy. In Numeracy we have been looking at missing numbers, number lines and estimating. All the children have settled in really well and we are enjoying learning together in our new classroom.

Class 1 St John's - In Reception this week we have been getting used to our class and school rules and routines and discovering our class environment. We have been working on our fine motor skills during dough disco and cutting activities. We have started collecting rewards for good behaviour and for trying hard or being helpful. We have enjoyed discovering all the areas of our classroom including the art and collage area and some of us have been working hard laying new pipes in our new outside area!

Class 2 Pott Shrigley - We have been looking at how to use patterns to help us add and subtract mentally. In Literacy we are working on performance poetry and in Science we have made a junk model of the digestive system.

Class 2 St John's - It has been a lovely week in Class two! The children are settling in brilliantly. In literacy this week we have been learning about Quest stories. We have done some drama and learnt how to write in the past and present tense. In maths we have been looking at place value of three digit numbers. In our topic work we have begun out exciting temples, tombs and treasures topic with and made our own River Nile fact files.

Class 3 Pott Shrigley - This week in Class 3 we have learned about decimal points in Numeracy. We have been multiplying them by 10,100 and 1,000. In Literacy we are learning about Stone Age Britain and have done our own timeline for Stonehenge.

Class 3 St John's - We've made a great start to the new academic year. In maths, we have been focusing on Place Value and column addition methods. In English, we have been looking at information texts linked to the Stone Age. We have also started our IPC topic, 'Making New Materials' where we have found out about solids, liquids and gases.
