Curriculum update

Class 1 Pott Shrigley — Class one have continued their work on fantasy stories, they have been exploring Mr Gumpy's outing and planning their own adventure. In maths we have started to work on fractions and have looked at halving numbers. As part of our topic we have explored the variety of food that is tradition at different events and planned for our baking next week.

Class 1 St John's – This week in Reception we have been naming and ordering the months of the year; we learnt a song to help us remember. We have started to look at the features of each season. We have learnt about colour mixing and we will link this to seasons next week.

Class 2 Pott Shrigley – In literacy we are reading different genres of Egyptian books. Our new one is called 'There's a Pharaoh in our bath' by Jeremy Strong. In maths we have been investigating fractions and division. Tom Y4

Class 2 St John's – This week in literacy we have been writing our own biographies about Edward Lear and learning some of his funny limericks. In maths we have been finding the difference using a number line. In science we have been on a habitat hunt in the schools grounds and found lots of creepy crawlies.

Class 3 Pott Shrigley - We have had an enjoyable week this week writing our fairy tale poems. We were even inspired to bake our own gingerbread men. They are delicious!

Class 3 St John's – This week in Class 3, in English we have been writing performance poems inspired by Fairy Tales. In maths, we have been looking at informal and formal division methods. In IPC, we have been looking at the different parts of the human eye and their functions.

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
