Coronavirus Advice

This week, we have sent you a flow chart and an information poster about coronavirus from the LA. Both of these are on the Virtual Office tab of the website, under the heading Coronavirus Updates. But here are the main messages for you:

Please do not send your child into school if they have **any** of the following symptoms:

- A new continuous cough this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours and/or
- A high temperature this means feeling hot to the touch on the chest or back (if a temperature cannot be taken) and/or
- A loss, or change, to their sense of smell or taste this means they have noticed they cannot small or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

Most people with coronavirus have at least one of these symptoms. You should only get a test if you have one or more of these symptoms. To book a test call the NHS on 119 or go online to <u>https://self-referral.test-for-coronavirus.service.gov.uk/antigen/name</u>

News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have enjoyed the beautiful weather and explored our garden space, creating shadow paintings and homes for snails. In phonics, we have focused on initial sounds and segmenting and blending short words orally. In maths, we have focused on how to be a good counter. We have looked at the names for different body parts and considered what they do and how they move. The children enjoyed measuring themselves using different units of measure.

News from Class 2

This week, in literacy, we have learnt all about verbs. We have thought about past and present tense verbs and their endings. We have used these in our sentence writing. Year Two have developed this further by adding adverbs to their writing. In maths, in Year One, we have been counting objects and comparing numbers to 20. In Year Two, we have been focusing on place value up to 20. In our topic work, we have learnt all about the brain. We made a brain out of jelly and learnt what all the different parts helped us with. We labelled brains and made mind maps of our favourite brain facts. In fun phonics club, we looked at the angry ai monster and did some watercolour painting of him. We collected ai words and played some beanbag games outside.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, children have continued to look at place value and have explored number lines. In literacy, children have enjoyed our class book, 'Leon and the place between'. In IPC, children have learnt about different types of scientific enquiry - we conducted a fair test to investigate the smallest letter a person could see from a certain distance. In R.E., we have studied the story of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector.

News from Class 4

This week, we have continued working on developing our understanding of Place Value in our math's lessons, focusing on rounding and negative numbers. In English, we have been writing newspaper reports based on our current class novel, 'The Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen. In IPC, we have been completing a map of Central America, using a key to show the main countries. We have labelled the location of the Maya civilisation and some of the cities. We have also been exploring primary and secondary sources of information.

Sports News

Class 1 - We have continued to focus on following instructions in PE. We have also started to explore balancing using different parts of our body.

Class 2 - We have practised bouncing balls along and passing to each other.

Class 3 - We practised our ball dribbling skills in football, and in our basketball lesson we also practised dribbling and, in addition, chest passes.

Class 4 – We have worked on developing our chest pass and bounce skills in basketball, and, in football, we have worked on side foot passing through gates.
