News from Reception

We started this week by reading two fantastic books, My Family Book and In Every House on Every Street. We discussed what family is to us and how this can be the same and different for other people. Since being at home, we have continued our discussions about family. The children have created some amazing family portraits and looked at different families on video. We have also continued to look at numicon and their shapes and value. In phonics, we continue to focus on segmenting and blending and the children have shown me some fantastic letter formation paintings.

News from Class 2

This week, in literacy, we have started our new class story, The Naughty Bus. The bus visited our classroom and made a terrible mess! The children wrote letters to the bus explaining the class rules and asking him not to do it again. We have moved onto writing captions for images from the story. In maths, we have learnt how to use place value charts and continued our work on part whole models. In Year 1, we have learnt how to count one more/one less than and moved onto comparing objects and numbers. In our topic work, we have looked at some different occupations in depth and thought about what their day to day tasks include.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, children have continued to look at place value. We looked at rounding numbers and began to explore negative numbers. In literacy, children have created a rough draft of their story based on 'Leon and the place between'. In IPC, children have continued research about the human digestive system. We have used ICT to research a healthy diet.

News from Class 4

This week, we have continued our work on addition and subtraction in our math's lessons, looking at using bar modelling and inverse operations to help us when solving problems. In English, we have continued with our work on our current class novel, 'The Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen. We have planned stories, using the story structure of the book to help us. In IPC, we have used sources of information to learn about daily life in Ancient Maya and the gods and goddesses the Maya people worshipped.

Sports News

Class 1 – The children were asked to focus on moving around a space safely and when instructed to 'stop', find a safe and strong position in which to hold their balance.

Class 2 – We worked on ball skills with a focus on dribbling. We played dodge ball and football.

Class 3 – In both our Basketball and football lessons, we focused on attacking 2 v 1. We used our decision making skills to decide whether to pass or dibble. We practised finding space on the court/pitch.
