News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have focused on the Hindu festival of Diwali. We have learnt about the traditions of this festival and the story of Rama and Sita. We have written speech bubbles to show what we think each character might say, created Rangoli and mehndi patterns and made diva lamps using clay. In maths, we have looked at the composition of 3, and we have introduced next week's focus of addition sums.

News from Class 2

This week, in Literacy, we went on a wonderful walk down the Middlewood Way to have a look at the stone arch bridge. We sketched the bridge and labelled it. When we got back to school, we used our experience to write a recount. We have learnt about four types of bridges and made a fact file about each one. In maths, we have looked at making equal groups, doubling and mental addition strategies. We had great fun recording our soap opera and hope you all enjoyed it. We took photographs in all of our wonderful costumes and have used these to do a piece of writing about our characters. In IPC, we have used our cross curricular maths links to make bar charts about different occupations.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, have focused on subtraction problems. In Literacy, we have continued our book, 'The Matchbox Diary' by Paul Fleischman. Children have created a ships log showing the voyage from Sicily to New York. In IPC, we have started our new topic of 'Island Life'. We have started to research the different continents and oceans.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been learning about equivalent fractions and how to convert between improper fractions and mixed numbers. In English, we have continued our work on 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. We have been writing narratives to go alongside the pictures in the book, focusing on setting descriptions and creating an atmosphere with our writing. In IPC, we have been learning about how light travels, how we see things and the different parts of the eye and their functions.

Sports News

Class 1 – Today in PE, we have learnt a Diwali dance and performed it ready to upload to Tapestry for the Reception parents to watch.

Class 2 – In PE, we focused on controlled jumping and varied jumps in different directions. We also learnt the basics of dodgeball.

Class 3 – This week, in hockey, we were passing and receiving and also dribbling around cones and passing through gates. In circuit training, we were recording scores on speed bounce and skipping, attempting to beat previous scores.

Class 4 – We have been working on dribbling and passing skills in hockey and have been recording our times in circuit training
