News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have continued our topic of weather with a focus on the water cycle and clouds. We have looked at different types of clouds and how they can be used to predict the weather. We created large scale pictures of clouds using loose parts and some beautiful water art using filter paper. In maths, we have continued to look at addition sums, focusing on the use of + and =.

News from Class 2

This week, in literacy, we have designed and labelled our own bridges and written explanations about how we made them. We have written thought bubbles for Rosie Revere and written letters to her encouraging her not to give up on her engineering dreams. In maths, we have looked at addition and subtraction on a number line and introduced fractions of shapes. In IPC, we have written about the characters we played in the Happy Valley soap opera and what their job entails. For Anti-bullying week, we looked at the song by Andy and the odd socks and carried out some activities based on the book "Ten little pirates" from our No Outsiders, relationships curriculum.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, children have continued to look developing addition and subtraction problems. Children have looked at subtraction problems that include multiple exchanges. We have thought about different ways to represent a problem such as bar models. In literacy, we have created a nonchronological report based on a new book, 'The Matchbox Diary' by Paul Fleischman. Children have researched the reasons why people would travel to America and what life was like once they arrived. In RE, children have started to look at different symbols used within Hinduism.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been continued to practise converting mixed numbers into improper fractions and visa versa. We have also explored number sequences involving fractions, and we have been learning to order and compare fractions by finding a common denominator. In English, we have continued our story writing, based on 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. This week, we have focused on editing skills. The filming of the Christmas Production has also been in full swing!

Sports News

Class 1 – This week, in PE, we took part in a relaxing yoga session. We focussed on our breathing and stretching all of our muscles.

Class 2 – This week, in PE, we played team games including dodge ball, and learnt balancing skills, jumping and different ways to bounce and throw balls.

Class 3 – This week, in hockey, we were busy attacking and defending and playing 1 vs 1 to get past defenders. We learnt to be fast and skilful. We also learnt the basic skills of dodge ball.
