Forest Schools and PE in January

School Council Initiative

After a successful School Council meeting last week, the children have decided they would like to have a non-uniform day to support children's mental health charities. We will therefore be having a comfortable clothes/pyjama day on Friday 12th February to raise funds for, and awareness of, this issue.

Government SATs and Testing Update

On 3rd December the Government announced the following in relation to next year's national tests: For primary assessments, key stage 1 tests in English reading and mathematics, and the English grammar, punctuation and spelling tests at key stage 1 and 2 will be removed for one year, in recognition of the challenges posed by the pandemic. Schools can take a flexible approach to the administration of the key stage 2 tests and phonics screening check, by extending the original timetable by a week, until 26 May and 25 June, respectively. Although primary performance data will not be published, teacher assessment in English reading, writing and mathematics at key stage 1, and all other assessments at key stage 2, will remain. The Year 4 multiplication test will be optional in 2021. There will be no requirement to submit science teacher assessment data.

News from Reception

This week, in Reception, we have read the story of Jack Frost by Kazuno Kahara which was perfectly timed for the weather we've had this week! We have focused on speech bubbles and labelling in literacy, and we have created ice sculptures out of cardboard and beads in art. In maths, we have looked at the formation of the number 5, and we've created a range of models using only 5 cubes. We have continued to practise our nativity show each day.

News from Class 2

This week, in literacy, we have been writing and sequencing the story of the Nativity. We broke the story down into 12 parts and wrote descriptive sentences for each one, working hard to remember our capital letters for proper nouns. In maths, we have focused on place value to 100, ordering

numbers and finding numbers in between any given 2 digit numbers. We have also been busy recording our special Christmas episode of Happy Valley "A special delivery". In PSHE, we read through the book called 'The odd egg'. We learnt how we are all proud of our differences and to respect others.

News from Class 3

This week, in literacy, we have created a diary based on the events of Shackleton's Journey. We looked at writing in the present perfect tense and using ambitious language. In maths, we have continued to look at multiplication and division, focusing on creating equal groups. We have been busy recording our special Christmas play, looking at how Christmas is celebrated around the world.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have been looking at subtraction of fractions by finding a common denominator and simplifying our answers, or converting them to mixed numbers, when possible. In English, we have written our final drafts of the stories we have written to go alongside the picture book, 'The Arrival' by Shaun Tan. In IPC, we have been carrying out investigations linked to how sounds can be changed, and we have focused on writing scientific predictions and conclusions.

Sports News

Class 1 – This week, in PE, we have played lots of team games focussing on teamwork and following instructions.

Class 2 – In PE, we practised jumping and hopping in different directions and in Boccia we practised our aiming, to reach various targets.

Class 3 – This week, in Hockey, we played matches, reinforcing the rules and understanding key skills. In Boccia, we were recording scores, endeavouring to beat our previous scores.

Class 4 – We have completed the school challenges for the Virtual School Games Challenge, finishing with bench ball.
