#### **Attendance**

Non-attendance is one of the single biggest blockers to achievement, with evidence suggesting that an attendance figure of below 96% will have a detrimental effect on the achievement of that individual student. By focusing on good attendance, we can make a significant impact to the outcomes of our pupils. While dealing with the challenges surrounding Covid-19, it felt appropriate to allow some flexibility with attendance authorisations (which remain at the discretion of the school). Although we intend to remain as supportive as possible, it is important to note that attendance will be a priority area this upcoming academic year.

## **News from Reception**

In Reception, this week we have read the story, 'When I Was Little Like You', which focuses on what life was like for Rosie's grandma when she was little. This led us to explore a history box from Macclesfield museum; we discussed what each item was and how it was used. Then, we matched it to its modern version and compared them. In maths, we have learnt how to be careful counters, focusing on small objects that can be moved, sounds and actions as well as larger objects that cannot be moved.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, Class 2 started a new English unit based on the book, 'Rosie Revere Engineer'. We practised our engineering skills by working together as a team to build an opening bridge using cardboard, string and tape. We had lots of fun and tested out different methods to build our bridges. Next week, we will be looking at Tower Bridge in London and describing the movement of the bridge. In maths, both classes have been working with number lines, counting the steps between numbers and estimating where numbers should be placed on a number line to 100. In IPC, we have planned a map of a town in geography and looked at our local area 100 years ago, discussing the job roles which existed then and now.

## **News from Class 3**

This week, in maths, we have looked at how to round to the nearest 10 and 100. We have continued to build fluency with the four times table. In English, we have continued our class book, 'Leon and the Place Between". The children have used their plan to create a story. We have focused on creating vivid descriptions using powerful verbs and interesting adjectives. In our topic of 'How Humans Work' the children have researched the digestive system. We have looked at the organs used in digestion and their functions.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, in Year 5, we have started to look at mental strategies for calculation, and, in Year 6, we have been looking at prime numbers, rules of divisibility and long multiplication. In English, we have continued reading 'The Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen, and we have planned and started writing our own apocalyptic stories. In IPC, we have continued our unit, '900CE', focusing on finding out about the Mayan society and comparing it to other civilisations that we have explored in the past. We have also been exploring the religious beliefs of the Maya.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – This week, we have been focusing on target practice. We threw beanbags into hoops on the floor and also into the basketball hoop. We threw balls into buckets and rolled them into hoops. We practised underarm and overarm actions to help us with these skills.

Class 2 – In PE, we practised ball control skills and team games.

Class 3 – This week, we played football and worked on passing skills. In basketball, we enjoyed some dribbling races, using our skills and manipulation techniques learnt.

Class 4 – This week, in football, we focused on passing accuracy, and, in basketball, we focused on dribbling and passing skills.
