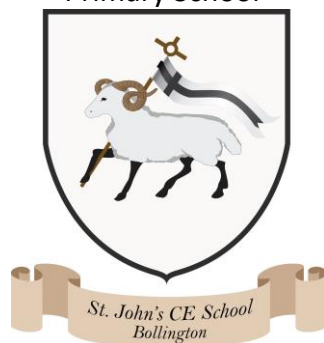

### **News from Reception**

This week in Literacy, we have looked at the differences between information books and story books; we then completed our tree study by creating our own information books about the trees we have on our school site. As Chinese New Year is approaching we have enjoyed exploring the traditions of this festival. We have read stories about the Emperor and the zodiac calendar, made lanterns during our art sessions, looked at Chinese symbols for numbers and animals and decorated dragon masks.

We have compared this festival to some of the others we have studied, looking at the similarities and differences between them all.

### **News from Class 2**

This week, Class 2 have written a newspaper report detailing the strange occurrences in our class book, 'The Grotlyn'. We looked at the features we needed to include, before planning our writing, then edited our work to check spelling, punctuation and how we could improve our vocabulary. In Maths, Year 1 have continued to explore numbers from 11 to 20 in detail, and found 1 more and 1 less than a number. Year 2 have continued addition and subtraction, using Base 10 to practise adding two 2 digit numbers. In IPC, we started our new topic: 'What's it Made of?', exploring different materials and their properties. We worked in groups to sort materials, and tested to see which were waterproof and transparent.

### **News from Class 3**

This week, the children have continued their maths topic of 'multiplication and division'. The children have looked at grouping multiples of 2, 3, 5, 6, 9 and 10. In English, the pupils have continued to enjoy our class book, 'The Matchbox Diary.' They have created their own matchbox diary and written an autobiographical piece. In our topic of 'Bienvenue en France', children have compared and contrasted Paris and Sheffield, created a biography of Napoleon and created a timeline.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, Year 5 have revised short multiplication and have started to learn long multiplication and 2-digit and 3-digit by 2-digit numbers. In Year 6, we have been working on measuring units, learning about imperial and metric units, including converting miles to km. In English, we have continued to explore the book 'Unspoken' by Henry Cole. We have been writing in role as the main character, focusing on creating atmospheric descriptions. In IPC, we have completed our Knowledge Harvest for our new IPC topic, 'The Story of English', and, in art, we have been exploring and creating illuminated letters.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – The children have been focussing on numbers this week using objects and games to create physical activities which need solving using counting, adding and subtraction.

Class 2 – This week, the focus has been gymnastics, using a partner to create innovative balances. These have then been demonstrated to the class.

Class 3 & 4 – We have been focusing on circuit training the children have been working on 30 second activities both on and off a variety of different circuit apparatus, working hard to complete them all as quickly as possible.
