This week I forwarded the changes in the DfE guidelines for schools, following the Prime Minister's press conference. In reality our operations at school will barely change at this point, but we are still hopeful that Step 4 of the roadmap will see more restrictions lifted. This week all classes participated in activities around nature, as this was the theme for this years 'Mental Health Awareness Week'. Our Wellbeing Ambassadors also had their second training session with Tytherington High School. On Tuesday next week, Class 4 will be taking part in a STEM electric grid power challenge. Thy Kingdom Come runs between Ascension and Pentecost, and this year takes place from 13<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> May.

### **News from Reception**

This week, in Reception, we received an exciting delivery of dinosaur bones. We have worked all week trying to piece them all back together and decide which dinosaur they belong to. We have written letters back to the professor to share our ideas. In maths, we have created numberlines up to 20 using numicon. We continue to practise our number bonds to 10. In IPC, we have created dinosaur skeleton pictures and as part of Mental Health Week, we created a joint piece of art with a focus on the 'big feelings' we all have.

### **News from Class 2**

This week, in literacy, we have written our own versions of 'Pig the Pug' using our new characters. We have turned these into mini books and designed our own front covers. In maths, we have finished our shape topic by looking at the shape of the faces on 3D shapes and finding horizontal and vertical lines of symmetry. In IPC, we have finished our torches and practised using them in the dark. We have drawn our own houses and labelled all of the electrical appliances in them, and we have looked at different types of energy, sound, light and heat. To mark mental health week, we have looked at trees and made a giant tree with our bodies, with each part of the tree representing a different aspect of our lives.

### **News from Class 3**

This week, Class 3 have continued to enjoy our topic of 'Temples, Tombs and Treasures'. Children have mummified an orange and started to create a canopic jar. In English, we have created story based on our class book, 'Cinderella of the Nile'. In maths, we have continued to look at money. In RE, we have looked at Jewish celebrations.

### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have looking at nets of 3D shapes and exploring how different nets can be used to make the same 3D shapes. We have also been revising long multiplication for up to four-digit numbers multiplied by two-digit numbers. In English, we have continued reading our new class novel, Anthony Browne's King Kong, and we have been writing letters in role as Ann Darrow, one of the main characters in the story. In IPC, we have learned the colours in French, and we have continuing exploring the work of the artist, Leonid Afremov, and creating our own artwork inspired by his unique style and technique.

### **Sports News**

Class 1 – In PE, the children took part in target practice and agility games.

Class 2 – In tennis, the children continued to practise controlling the ball on a racket and also played a game to practise swinging and stopping the ball.

Class 3 – In circuit training, the children were focusing on agility and endurance. They used different objects to work different body parts. In bench ball, the children were developing their throwing and catching skills, they then worked in teams in a tournament.

Class 4 – This week, as it was raining, we played benchball in the hall. We split into 4 teams and had matches. We also played a version of Simon Says, clapping when the ball bounced on the floor. Adelphi and Clarence house won.
