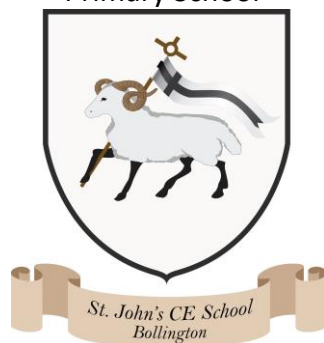

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have read the story Dinosaur Roar to help us learn about opposites. We have created our own opposites and labelled them.

In maths, we have focused on the composition of teen numbers using ten frames and numicon to help us count.

We have created several art pieces for the exhibition, including the Japanese art of Hapezome.

News from Class 2

In English this week, Class 2 have thought about what they are thankful for and written a diary entry. We started to plan a report for our own imaginary creature. Year 2 began their Special Agent Training (SATs) by completing booklets to assess reading and comprehension skills.

In maths, we completed our unit on multiplication and division and began looking at fractions, finding a half of a shape and a number.

In IPC, we explored microhabitats, learning how to look carefully under rocks and logs, and recording the creatures we found. We thought about the features of the microhabitat and why those creatures were found there. We also took part in a live lesson by the Tree Council about hedgerows linked to our habitats topic.

News from Class 3

This week, Year 3 looked at mass and capacity. They have looked at using scales and measuring in kilograms and grams. Year 4 have continued to look at decimals. We looked at dividing by 10 and 100 and how to make a whole using hundredths. In English, we have started out new book called ‘Weslandia’ by Paul Fleischman. The children created predictions about the story and created descriptions using adverbials. We have started our new topic of ‘Feel the Force’. We have completed a Knowledge Harvest and a fact file about forces. As part of art week, the pupils have created sketches of flowers and a sculpture of a cherry blossom.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on reflections and lines of symmetry. In Year 6, the children have been completing investigations which involved working on problems using an organised system. In English, we have completed our stories, inspired by ‘The Princess’ Blankets’ by

Carol Ann Duffy. In IPC, we have been exploring the artwork of Leonid Afremov inspired by Paris. We have also been creating work for the art exhibition at Bollington Art Centre. We have worked on careful drawing of flowers in colour and making flower structures, using wire and tissue paper.
