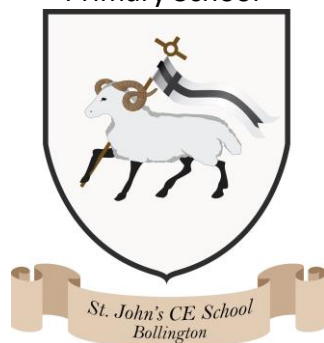

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have focused on the story of The Gingerbread Man. We have written sentences to describe him and the setting of the river, with a big focus on our sentence structure. In maths, we have started to look at 'First, Then and Now' as a way to work out the sum from an addition or subtraction story or word problem.

We have said goodbye to our bluetit family as the six babies fledged this week. It's been an amazing experience tracking their growth and seeing the life cycle of a wild bird in action.

News from Class 2

In English this week, we have started a new book – Send for a Superhero by Michael Rosen. We started by making a prediction about the characters Vacuum and Filth, what they might do and how we could get rid of them. We shared ideas as a class and wrote our sentences using conjunctions to expand our answers. In maths, we continued to explore fractions, with Year 2 finding a third and finding the whole from a fraction, and Year 1 recognising and then finding a quarter of an object and number. In IPC, we made animal food chains, labelling the producer, consumer, predator and prey for each chain. In RE, our topic this half term is creation. We revisited the story of creation, considered how God's beautiful world made us feel and then moved on to look at the story of Adam and Eve.

News from Class 3

This week, the children have enjoyed a fantastic trip to Manchester Science and Industry Museum. You can find lots of fun pictures in our gallery. In maths, Class 3 have continued to look at money. We looked at solving money problems, how to find change and complete calculations with money. In English, we have continued to read our class book, 'Weslandia' by Paul Fleischman. The children have started to create a travel brochure. We have looked at persuasive techniques of writing. We have started our topic of 'Temples, Tombs and Treasures'. The children have created a knowledge harvest and thought about the questions they want answered about Ancient Egypt.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working with negative numbers, including finding the difference between positive and negative integers. In Year 6, the children have been completing investigations involving solving problems using organised lists. In English, we have completed our speech and diary entries based on 'Otto: The Autobiography of a Teddy Bear' by Tomi Ungerer.

On Thursday, we enjoyed our fantastic trip to the Bridgewater Hall to play with the Hallé, and we have continued with our rehearsals for Oliver, our end of year production.
