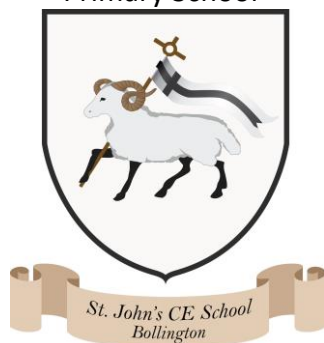

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Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week we have enjoyed learning about birds. In Literacy we have been labelling the features of a Robin and in Maths we have focussed on finding a total when adding two single digit numbers together. We have made simple bird feeders and watched the birds enjoying them from our bird hide outside. We have looked at the similarities and differences between bird species and how their features can help us understand what food they eat. We placed the birds into several different categories to show the differences. We took part in the RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch and we will send our results next week.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been retelling the story of Jack and the beanstalk. We have made story maps and some drama. In maths we have been doing number bonds to 10/20 and using these to help us add and takeaway. In our topic work we have learnt all about Queen Elizabeth and her family.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, we have revisited column subtraction. We have continued to look at volcanoes in our topic 'Active Planet'. In literacy, we have created a story based on 'Mr Stink' and used our learning to improve our writing.

Class 4 – This week we have been finishing our stories in English. In maths, we have been focusing on short and long multiplication. In RE, we have been retelling the parable of The Pharisee and the Tax Collector and reflecting on its message. In IPC, we have made Greek Pots using clay.

Sports news – Class 1 and 2 have been doing basic movements through fitness exercises and basketball skills. Class 3 and 4 have been doing small-sided basketball matches and refereeing their own games.



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
