News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have started our new topic of dinosaurs by gathering our own knowledge and fact checking with our non-fiction books. We have started our study of fossils and how they are formed. In maths, we have learnt more about number bonds to ten by focusing on the 'missing number'. We are still enjoying the chicks and we've taken it in turns to read and sing to them. We are eagerly waiting for the bluetit eggs to hatch so we can compare the chicks to our own.

News from Class 2

Our highlight of the week was the Victorian Toys workshop on Tuesday, which was delivered by Jodie from the Macclesfield Silk Museum. We had a wonderful morning and the children really enjoyed it! In maths this week, Year 1 have been learning about equal groups and arrays, whilst Year 2 have been learning about units of measurement. In English, we have continued our extended writing about the Moon and the children have produced some fantastic work. On Thursday afternoon, we had the pleasure of visiting St Oswald's church - we learnt about the features of a church and baptism. In art, we learnt how to plait and the children created some wonderful art work.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, Year 3 have started their new topic of fractions. Children have looked at how to add and subtract fractions as well as unit and non-unit fractions of objects. Year 4 have continued to look at decimals. They have looked at making a whole using tenths and hundredths and comparing amounts using place value. In grammar, the children have looked at spelling rules for common words as well as how to connect two main clauses. In history, they have started to look at Anglo Saxon villages and how they differed to the Roman settlements in Britain. In our computing lesson, they have used variables to create their own quizzes. In RE, the children have looked at the five Ks of Sikhism.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on decimals, and Year 6 have been working on coordinates, including translations and problem solving. In English, we have designed an imaginary creature, and we are now creating guide books about how to look after it. A highlight has been our art lesson where we have been designing a piece of artwork inspired by Maya symbols.
