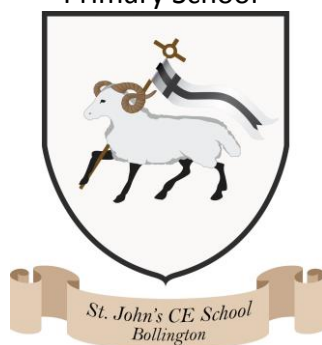

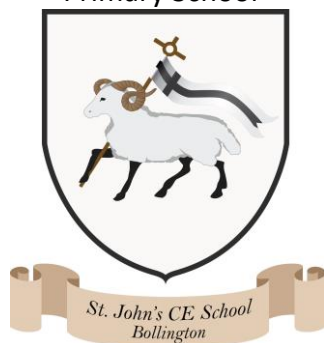
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School Uniform

Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we completed our first level of coding. The children have done really well. In literacy we have recalled our learning about bees and we have written sentences to describe the roles of the bee during its lifetime. We have continued to care for our garden during this warm weather.

Class 2 – This week in literacy we have been writing character descriptions about our new friends we made for Beegu. We have also written predictions about what we think will happen next in the story. In maths we have been looking at position and direction and handling data. We went outside to do a traffic survey of Grimshaw lane. We used our data to create pictograms and bar charts. In IPC we have looked at the history of flight.

Class 3 – This week, in maths, children have continued to explore division problems. In literacy we have started a new unit based on the book 'Wolves in the Walls'. Children have reviewed features of fiction and non-fiction writing. In IPC, children have thought about the local area and examined maps of Bollington. On Thursday, children were excited to start creating felt and tiles ready for display next week.

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Class 4 – In maths we have been looking at binary numbers and working out as many numbers in binary to 20 (at some above!) as we could. In English, we have been writing our own warning stories. We have also started a theme park design project. We had a fantastic afternoon on Wednesday afternoon Jessica Owen - the artwork produced was amazing! We have also been practising hard for the Leavers' Assembly.

Sports News – In PE class 1 continued to practise our throwing and catching skills using a range of equipment. Class 2 have played tennis concentrating on ball control and also practised for sports day. Class 3 have also started to practice for sports day and Class 4 have been working on athletics skills and football and gymnastics.

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
