Head's Message

Our 2024 Academy Programme is up and running and was such a lot of fun. My thanks to all the staff, parents and community volunteers who have worked so diligently to make this the best year ever. Our girls secured a historic 4-1 victory in their football match against Rainow. We are now officially on a winning streak. While I am writing this newsletter two girls from Year 6 have brought me a delicious mid-afternoon toasted marshmallow treat. My newly appointed Duck Monitors are visiting me thrice daily to discuss the duck movements on the field (best part of my day without a doubt), and Class 4 are thrilled at the prospect of their parents joining them for a P4C session (please see below). Reception class had a wonderful visit to Bollington library on Wednesday, as we keep up our campaign to ensure the library stays open. Thank you to all the parents who accompanied us. We were delighted this week to welcome PC Marc Harley to school to deliver an online safety talk to parents and then to the junior children. Thank you to all the parents who attended, and I do hope you found it informative. I am aware that a local group has been established to try and encourage a smartphone free childhood, which I think is an amazing initiative. Yesterday, we were proud to commemorate D-Day in all our classes, and a special poem was read to the children at 11am entitled, 'D-Day Heroes'. Next week is already looking jam packed. We will be administering both the Phonics Screening Check to Year 1 and the Multiplication Tables Check to Year 4. Class 3 have their school trip to Chester, and we have a rounders match against Dean Valley. Looking further ahead, I have also reminded the children that our Talent Shows will take place on Friday 5th July. Finally, please note there are three attachments with this newsletter. Catering Update

We are working very hard to end our current contract with the local authority, and take catering inhouse from September. We are confident we will be able to do so. This has allowed us to create a menu based entirely on our children's lunch preferences, as we have surveyed every child at St John's. It also means we will be able to offer school meals at a much more competitive price than the local authority can. As it stands the LA are proposing schools meals will have to rise to £3.20 in September with a further rise in January. Some local schools have already moved to this price structure. This is not acceptable to us. At St John's we have worked tirelessly to try to get better

value for our parents. We are confident will be able to set school lunches at £2.85 from September. Although we will have to slightly raise our prices, I do hope you can appreciate the efforts we are going to in order to keep the school meal cost as low as possible. It goes without saying that we would be able to reduce our prices if more children ate with us and so we do encourage families to think about the benefits of ordering a hot school meal. Class 4 Invite Parents to P4C lesson

Class 4 are very excited to invite their parents to join them (actively taking part) in a P4C session. P4C stands for Philosophy for Children, and is a lesson structure which promotes deep thinking and discussion about big issues. At St John's we have embedded P4C in our RE and PSHE curriculums. The children thought it would be fun for their parents to experience part of their learning first hand. Therefore, we hope to see you all at 9.45 - 10.30am on Wednesday 17th July following the Year 6 Bible presentation.

News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have started our storyteller project. We have focused on the traditional tale of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. We have learned lots of interesting new vocabulary and created a

story plan ready for us to retell the story in our own words next week. In maths, we have used rekenreks to help us recall the number bonds to ten. We all loved our trip to Bollington library on Wednesday; we spent time with the librarians and shared lots of great stories. It was a fantastic way to round off our dinosaur topic.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our art and design lesson where we made our very own paper sculptures. We used our previous knowledge from maths to make a cylinder and then designed some fantastic sculptures. In maths, Year 1 have been learning about quarters, and Year 2 have been learning about thirds. In English, we have learnt about sequels whilst writing and discussing our predictions for the next part of our text. We have started a new geography unit where we are learning about the coast and all the wonderful things we can find there. Also, in science, our new topic is 'Making Connections' and we enjoyed being observational scientists in our first lesson about tree trunks.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have continued our topic of time. We have looked at how to tell the time on a digital clock, am and pm and days, months and years. In English, the children have completed reading our class book, 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin'. We have written a persuasive letter to the mayor and justified our opinions using evidence. In our computing lesson, the pupils have started to examine computational thinking.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have continued to explore negative numbers, including counting forwards and backwards through them and finding the difference between positive and negative integers. In Year 6, we have been revising long multiplication and division and working on solving problems with many solutions logically. In English, we have written our own stories based on the animation, The Lighthouse. We have also started exploring the book, 'The Long Thing', by Shaun Tan. Another highlight this week has been using Microsoft MakeCode to learn about the basic features of a Micro:Bit and create our own codes.
