News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have been busy writing up our story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff using our story plans to help us. We have created watercolour paintings of the story setting and made puppets of each character. In maths, we have used the rekenreks to help us answer simple addition sums. We all loved making artwork for our Father's Day cards.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was moving on to our new maths topic of time. I have been so impressed with the children's knowledge, resilience and determination in this new topic. Year 1 have started learning about the language associated with time and Year 2 have focussed on o'clock and half past. In English, we have used the conjunction 'but' and begun our creative writing about a character from the text. In RE, we have been learning about the story of 'Joseph and his Multi-coloured Coat. In geography, the children have thoroughly enjoyed learning about the seas and oceans that surround the UK, and we can't wait to continue our learning about the coast.

News from Class 3

This week, in maths, the children have continued our topic of time. The children have looked at seconds, minutes and hours. They have thought about how to choose the most effective unit of measurement when looking at duration. In English, they have started to create their own narrative based on our class book, 'The Pied Piper of Hamelin'. We have used fronted adverbials in our build up and then looked at including all our literacy tools such as simile, metaphor and expanded noun phrases. In history, we have started to look at the end of Anglo-Saxon rule, and the events that led to the battle of Hastings in 1066. On Wednesday, Class 3 visited the Grosvenor Museum in Chester. We can be proud of how Class 3 represented our school when out in public. They were well mannered and keen to share their learning. We attended a workshop about Roman Chester, and our instructor told us that we are the first class ever to be able to talk in detail about the Roman pilum! We were led around the city by a Roman centurion and visited the amphitheatre and the Roman gardens.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, Year 5 have been working on converting units of measures, for example, km to m and I to mI. In Year 6, we have been revising division, giving remainders as fractions. In English, we have been writing stories based on 'The Lost Thing' by Shaun Tan. Another highlight this week was in technology, where we explored the 'farm to fork' production of beef products. We have also had our auditions for our end of year production, 'Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat'.
