This week in Reception, we have had a wonderful start to our school year. The children have settled in beautifully! We are all getting used to the new routine of school whilst exploring our environment.

News from Class 2

This week our highlight has been welcoming Class 2 back to school, a wonderful start to the new year. Everyone has settled in so well and we have had a super week. Tuesday saw us begin our first maths topic, place value, where Year 1 were using 10 frames to represent numbers and Year 2 solving problems with ten frames. We have enjoyed our early morning handwriting sessions which I'm sure will help us with our writing in the coming weeks. In science, we have been labelling different parts of the human body. In history, we have been learning about chronology and ordering events of the school day. In art, we enjoyed painting our own self-portraits which are now on display in the classroom!

News from Class 3

This week, we have had a wonderful start to the academic year in Class 3. The children have settled really well into their new routines and have behaved beautifully. In English, we have started our new book, Leon and the Place Between. We have explored describing settings using our senses and making our sentences more interesting using adverbs and adjectives. We carried out some experiments with cups and ping pong balls in science to illustrate contact and non-contact forces, and we looked at diversity and inclusion in PSHE. Children wrote about the qualities that make them unique which we placed anonymously in our No Outsiders cup. Today was a beautiful day to end the

week with our first visit to Forest Schools. A special welcome this week to our new class members, Laela and Neymar.

News from Class 4

It's been a wonderful first week back for Class 4! This week, in maths, we have started working on ensuring that we have a great understanding of place value to 1,000,000, and that we can also read and write these numbers. We have also been working on reading and writing Roman numerals. In English, we have started work on 'Firebird' by Saviour Pirotta. We have begun to write descriptions using expanded noun phrases with carefully chosen vocabulary. In history, we have been learning what a census is and how they can teach us about the past.
