#### **News from Reception**

This week in Reception, we have loved reading the story Martha Maps It Out. We were inspired to create maps of our local area using photos of familiar places. We also learnt how to make a key for a map using simple symbols. In maths, we have focused on capacity using a range of jugs in the water tray and repeating patterns in both actions and objects.

### News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our art lesson where were sketching expressions to help us understand our emotions. In maths this week, Year 1 have been using different resources to make number bonds to 10, whilst Year 2 have been using fact families to deepen their understanding of addition sentences. In English, we have enjoyed writing commands with contractions. In science, we have explored our sense of sight in different areas of the school, and in RE we enjoyed learning about the Old and New Testaments.

#### News from Class 3

This week started with an exciting afternoon on Monday when we watched the Saltmine Theatre Company's performance of 'The Rhyming Bible' which we all really enjoyed. In maths, we have been learning how to read and write Roman Numerals, and we have nearly completed our unit on place value. In science, we looked at uses of magnets in our day to day lives. We finished our pavilion structures in DT and these looked fantastic! In English, we finished writing our final version of Leon and the Place Between and started our exciting new story, 'The Matchbox Diary'.

#### **News from Class 4**

This week, in maths, we have been exploring multiples, common multiples and factors. In English, we have started a new Literacy Tree unit, 'Boy in the Tower' by Polly Ho-Yen. We have been making predictions and exploring what we can learn about the key characters in the first few chapters of the story. A highlight this week was our music lesson where we used the xylophones to play a walking bass line to 'Rock Around the Clock'.
