The children make speedy progress as the scheme is very precise. There is also a greater emphasis on fluency. Thank you for your support as switching scheme mid-term has been quite the challenge!





## Attendance Reminder from the LA

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices for school absence, the following changes came into force on 19 August 2024. Penalty notices will be issued for:

- Term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days.
- 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a rolling 10 school week period.

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for a term time leave or irregular attendance, the penalty notice will be charged at £160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days of issue, reducing to £80 if paid within 21 days. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution.) When a second Penalty Notice is issued to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first penalty

notice, for either term time leave or irregular attendance, the second Penalty Notice will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days, with no reduced fee for paying early. (Unpaid penalty notices may result in a parental prosecution.) The third time an offence is committed within 3 years of the first Penalty Notice, for either a term time leave or irregular attendance, the case may proceed to Parental Prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'failure to send a child to school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to £1000.

## **News from Reception**

Reception we have used the book 'Tree' to help us learn all about the seasons and how they change. We focused on the key features of each season and discussed what we might see, feel and hear. The children created tree paintings inspired by the beautiful artwork in the book. In maths, we have looked at the different ways of representing numbers to 5 and the number bonds to match.

#### **News from Class 2**

This week, our highlight was our science lesson where we explored different areas of our school to find objects that are made out of different materials. Once we had identified many different objects, we returned to our books to document our findings. In maths this week, Year 1 have been using number lines to complete calculations. Year 2 have been using numbers up to 100 to estimate on number lines, and we have explored 'one more and one less' with our key representations. In English, we have been reading 'The Bear and the Piano' and we have discussed, considered and written about the bear's feelings at different stages in the story. In geography, we enjoyed learning about features of landscapes and features of our playground. In computing, we used iPads to create a media story of what happens in our 'Favourite Toy in School' story.

#### **News from Class 3**

In maths, we have been learning how to do exchanges in column addition across tens and hundreds, and the children have picked this up really well. In science, we investigated the properties of gases and liquids and explored how we can compress a gas. In English, we thought about how we would feel embarking on an exciting but perilous journey, and we wrote a telegram home to describe how we might feel upon arriving at South Georgia, on the edge of Antarctica. In art and design, we used our knowledge from last week on shading and tinting, and painted some objects using this knowledge. In RE we are learned more about why many Christians think Jesus is the light of the world, and we started singing our two nativity songs.

This week, in maths, we have been working on using common denominators to add, subtract and order both proper fractions and mixed numbers. In English, we have been continuing our work on 'Otto: The Autobiography of a Teddy Bear'. We have been writing a newspaper report about the part of the story where Otto saves a soldier's life. Other highlights this week have been our computing lesson, where we have been exploring how AI processes and responds to text prompts, and our science lesson, where we have been investigating air resistance.
