Curriculum update:

Class 1 – This week in Reception we have done a seed investigation where we examined different seeds closely under a strong magnifying glass. We have focused on what seeds need in order to grow and we have set up an investigation with cress seeds to see how they grow in different conditions. We have started to look at the book 'The Journey Home' and we have learnt lots of facts about polar bears to put in our polar bear fact files.

Class 2 – This week we have been writing biographies about Samuel Pepys. We thought of some questions for him and were lucky enough to travel back in time to 1666 and meet the man himself. In maths we have been looking at subtraction and using counting on to help us. In IPC we have been ordering the events of the Great fire of London.

Class 3 – In maths, children have looked at grid method multiplication. In literacy, we have used our learning to create reports based on the human digestive system. We have enjoyed Science week this week and in IPC, we have undertaken three science experiments. Children created a model of the digestive system. Children used charcoal toothpaste when learning about tooth care and created their own obstacle courses in PE thinking about how they can use their bodies.

Class 4 – This week, in maths, we have been looking at multiplication and division of fractions, including reasoning and problem solving skills. In English, we have finished our newspaper reports, based on our current novel, 'The Boy in the Tower'. In IPC, we have created spread sheets for a holiday budget, using Microsoft Excel, and we have made tourist information booklets about countries of our choice. As part of British Science Week, we have been looking at how information about weather was collated historically, and we have taken part in some national data collection online.

Sports News – Class 1 and Class 2 had two really enjoyable lessons which included playing football and doing some gymnastics work. Class 3 tried out their archery skills and also undertook a fitness circuit. Class 4 also played archery and rounded off their session with bench ball.
