News from Reception

This week in Reception, we have learnt all about animals that camouflage. We have looked at a beautifully illustrated book that inspired us to create our own pictures of different habitats using oil pastels and then added in hiding animals. In maths, we have focused on balance scales and comparing the weights of different objects. We carried out an investigation and recorded our findings in a table.

News from Class 2

This week, our highlight was our science lesson where we have been classifying living things and objects. In maths this week, Year 1 have been using their knowledge of number bonds to 10 to subtract to and from a multiple of 10. Year 2 have been using number lines to subtract to and from a multiple of 10. In English, we have enjoyed reading the story Elmer and planning our own end to the story. We will be writing our story ending next week! In art, we have enjoyed experimenting with colours to make different shades and tones. In PSHE, we have been learning about staying safe outdoors and with appliances in our homes. In RE, we enjoyed discussing and writing about why Jesus is a good friend.

News from Class 3

This week in maths, we continued our unit on multiplication and division, focusing on developing fluency in times tables. In English, we continued using a range of writing devices to help with planning a mystery story, and the children have now chosen their favourite picture from the Mysteries of Harris Burdick upon which they will base their short story. In science, we enjoyed another interesting lesson learning about how sound travels using basic telephones made out of cups and string. In French, we practised asking and responding to the question 'how are you?'. In RE, we learned more about how Jesus changed lives through the story of Zacchaeus. We enjoyed a wonderful family lunch on Wednesday and it was a joy to see families sharing lunch with our Year 3 children.

News from Class 4

This week, in maths, we have continued exploring decimals to three decimal places, focusing on rounding decimals to various degrees of accuracy. In English, we have completed our recounts, based on 'Unspoken' by Henry Cole. Other highlights this week have been making our playground equipment designs in our design and technology lessons- the results are fantastic- and learning

about the similarities and differences between the city states of Athens and Sparta in our history lesson.
